

Engagement Team Missions Update

Crop Walk results -Last October our congregation raised \$2,377.75. The Forsyth County walk raised \$95,317.03 for Church World Services, Crisis Control and Sunnyside Ministry. Church World Services received 75% to provide disaster relief, agriculture education, clean water for over 65 countries. The other 25% was given to Crisis Control Ministry and Sunnyside Ministry. Those funds supported each of those local ministries to assist families with food and services. Mark your calendar for October 20 and walk or make contribution to support this worthy cause this fall. Thank you for your generous support! Our focus to collect Mineral Springs Elementary School supplies will begin in June since our local school

JUNETEENTH - June 19th

Juneteenth began in Galveston, TX on June 19th 1865 and celebrates the day Major General Gordon Granger of the United States Union Army arrived to enforce the emancipation proclamation issued by President Lincoln more than 2 years prior on January 1st 1863. The Union Army made their way across the country, and finally to Texas, one of the last slave holding states to surrender, to free the slaves from bondage. The emancipation proclamation was in response to confederate states refusal to acknowledge the two previous manumission efforts enacted by congress in first and second Confiscation acts of 1861 and 1862 that would issue reparations to the slave owners for voluntarily releasing their captives. Juneteenth was first celebrated as "Jubilee Day" on June 19th 1866 and quickly began to spread throughout the south, and it was recognized as an official federal holiday on June 19th 2021. In the 1870s and 1880s, the formerly enslaved Africans celebrated their freedom with rodeos, theater, barbeques and other festivities, and in the face of suppression of their celebrations Black leaders purchased "Emancipation Park" in Houston TX to hold celebrations of Juneteenth without threat of violence or discrimination. Today, Juneteenth is celebrated nationwide as a day of remembrance and community.

Due to a manufacturing defect from the mill, the previously installed carpet in the sanctuary is scheduled for replacement during the last week of May. Following the reinstallation of carpet and a required handrail for ramp access to the platform, we are set for a final inspection from the city. It will take some additional time to upholster pews, establish the media equipment, and prepare for worship and livestreaming in the renovated sanctuary. 


