Sunday August II was a great celebration at PHBC as we dedicated our renovated/updated sanctuary on the 67th anniversary of the church. The worship service was followed by a wonderful fellowship meal. After four years – that included COVID, renovation design, construction delays, and construction – I am excited about what lies ahead for Peace Haven Baptist Church. We are still moving forward with updates to the fellowship hall (carpet and paint), a new roadside sign, and landscaping additions. These projects are all included in the Building Hope, Growing Faith Funding Campaign.

As I said in my sermon on August 11, there is still a race to run (Hebrews 12:1-2).The completion of sanctuary renovations must motivate and inspire us to enter more fully and faithfully into the labor of the Lord. In John 4:34-45, Jesus said to his disciples: "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to complete his work. Do you not say, 'Four months more, then comes the harvest'? But I tell you, look around you, and see how the fields are ripe for harvesting."

As a church family, our food must be the will of the Lord who established this congregation. As a church family, our determination must be to complete – that is bring to its appointed goal – the purpose for which this congregation was established by the Lord. Peace Haven Baptist Church of Winston-Salem exists to make disciples for the Kingdom of God in and through Jesus Christ, to baptize and to teach the way of Jesus Christ, to worship the Lord and witness to Jesus Christ, to live as a communion of saints in, with, and under Jesus Christ.

Now What?With eyes fixed on Jesus (Hebrews 12:2), let us embrace the mandate and mission of our Lord and Savior with faith, hope, and love.



## **Media Ministry Training**

Workshop 1 - LIVE STREAM - Most Difficult of the 3

Tuesday, September 10 at 6:30pm. (Please allow at least 2 hours)

At this workshop, we will go over the basics of production of a Sunday morning worship. This will include how to operate the cameras, evaluate and adjust the overall volume being sent out over the LIVE broadcast as well as individual channel volumes on the sound board. How to go LIVE, how to change the camera angles while LIVE, when to go LIVE and when to go off-air, and more.

Workshop 2 - Worship Presentation (Slides) - Least Difficult of the 3 (Perfect for beginners of all ages and teens)

Thursday, September 12 at 6:30pm. (Please allow at least 1.5 hours)

At this workshop, we will go over the PROCLAIM software that is used to run the worship presentations each week. We will include how to check that all information is correct including song lyrics, scriptures, the right person is listed etc. We will also cover how to turn on the TV's and how to send the feed from the computer to the TV's and more.

Workshop 3 - Sound System - Middle Difficulty of the 3

Tuesday, September 17 at 6:30pm (Please allow at least 1.5 hours)

At this workshop we will go over the sound board and the different sound mixes that are used during a Sunday service. How to turn everything on, how to turn everything off, how to locate feedback and what buttons to push or move during a normal Sunday service and more.
