Jon Redding - Former WFU Intern 2009 - 2012

Dr. Jonathan Redding's influential research on Biblical interpretation and unwavering support of students has earned him one of the highest honors in academia at Nebraska Wesleyan University.

Redding has been chosen as the inaugural holder of the Dr. Anne MacLeod Cognard Professorship in the Humanities. "This is a tremendous honor, and I'm beyond grateful for this opportunity," says Redding, associate professor of religion. "To receive this professorship at this stage of my career, is humbling and empowering. This gives me the chance to help students see what writing, creativity, and bold thinking can get them. I want them to see the power and importance of writing and reading with a critical eye. We put students and learning first, so this professorship grants me the chance to model the type of practical academic work we share with students here and beyond."

Since 2017, Redding has been a faculty member in the Department of Religion and Philosophy. He has distinguished himself as a scholar by authoring three books on Biblical interpretation; he is the recipient of the Margaret J. Prouty Teaching Award, the University's top teaching award; and he provides outstanding support and service to the University and students. Named professorships are considered among the university's leading faculty members. It lends prestige to the university and recipient, helps recruit and retain top talent and inspires faculty colleagues in their work.

Weekday Policy - Our policy aligns with Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Schools (WSFCS):

Weekend Policy - In the event of winter weather over the weekend when school is not in session, decisions about services and events will be made as early as possible. Updates will be communicated through the following channels:

Labyrinth Walks at PHBC

The labyrinth is a sacred path with one way in and one way out; one cannot get lost on a labyrinth walk. The labyrinth differs from a maze in that mazes have multiple paths which branch off, many different paths that may not lead to the center, and sometimes even "traps" which makes walking a maze difficult and unpredictable. (A lot like life).

Explaining the labyrinth walk with words is like trying to describe experiencing a vast ocean and then putting the experience into a coke bottle. The labyrinth walk is difficult to describe because the journey is so much more than words express. The labyrinth walk is a spiritual journey. One way to think about this is as you walk into the labyrinth, you are walking to God, and with each step, you let go of thing(s) that separate you from God. When you arrive at the center of the labyrinth, it is helpful to offer a prayer to God for whatever you feel led to talk to God about as it relates to your journey with God. Sometimes, at the Center of the labyrinth, you may feel that you just want to be quiet and be present with God in that way. That is fine as well, it is important to do (be) with what you feel you are led to do (be).

As you journey out of the labyrinth, it is helpful to meditate or pray on those things that help you on our earthly journey. You may even feel that you acquire spiritual tools on your journey out of the labyrinth. There are different ways to use the labyrinth for nurturing your relationship with God, this is one example.

You are invited to participate in our monthly labyrinth walks. Walking the labyrinth is a solitary activity, communing with God. However, the monthly labyrinth walk in community with others enriches the solitary experience. When you walk the labyrinth during our monthly walks, we pray, then walk the labyrinth. After everyone finishes their walk, there is optional time to spend together sharing the experience in whatever way you feel comfortable. It is meditative, safe space in that the term "what is said here, stays here" applies.

With all my heart, I hope you will join us in this meaningful experience both individually and in community. In addition, there will be a series of Sunday afternoon walks as we journey through the season of Lent.

All walks are on Sunday afternoons (dates are listed below) and all are scheduled at 3:00 pm. Walk dates are: January 26 February 16 March 9, 16, 23, 30 April 6, and 13 You may attend one walk or attend all of the walks. If you have any questions, just let me know, Rev.
