## The Survey Says .....

In a recent article - What If Everything We Thought About the “Nones” Was Wrong? – Tripp Fuller, a graduate of WFU Divinity and founder of Homebrewed Christianity in 2008 ([www.homebrewedchristianity.com](http://www.homebrewedchristianity.com)) shares some interesting insights from a survey of the NONES: that growing segment of Americans who check “no religious affiliation” on surveys. Researchers discovered that the 100 million Americans with no religious affiliation aren’t one thing at all. There are four very different groups with radically different relationships to faith, meaning, and the reality of the divine. Below are some excerpts for reflection.

### **Surprise #1: Twenty Million “Nones” Pray Every Day**

The researchers call them “NiNos” — Nones in Name Only. They account for about 21% of the unaffiliated, meaning roughly 20 million Americans fall into this category. These people pray daily. Many believe in God without doubt. They don’t hate religion. They don’t distrust God. They just... don’t belong anywhere.

### **Surprise #2: The “Spiritual But Not Religious” Aren’t Really That Spiritual**

“I’m not religious, but I’m very spiritual.” This group is large — 36% of all nones, about 36 million people. But the vast majority aren’t doing anything spiritual at all. They want to be spiritual, they think of themselves as spiritual, but they haven’t built a spiritual life.

### **Surprise #3: Pascal Was Probably Wrong**

For centuries, Christian theology has rested on an assumption articulated most famously by Blaise Pascal: that every human being has a “God-shaped hole” that can only be filled by the Divine. A third of all nones — about 33 million Americans — challenge that assumption directly. Researchers call them “the Dones.” They’re done with religion. Done with spirituality. Done with God. They don’t pray (99% say “seldom or never”). They don’t attend services. They don’t yearn for the divine or spiritual. They’re not miserable. They’re not searching. The “Dones” say they are just fine.

### **Surprise #4: The Loudest Voices Are the Smallest Group — And the Most Unhappy**

The zealous atheists and mockers of religion. They represent just 11% of the nones — about 3% of all Americans. They’re the least satisfied with their lives of any group in the study. They score lowest on meaning, purpose, self-worth, and hope. Their war with religion hasn’t set them free. Something is wrong, and they’re in pain.

### **Surprise #5: There Is No Gen Z Revival (folks born between 1997-2012)**

There’s been a lot of anecdotal buzz about young people returning to faith, whispers of a revival on the horizon. The data doesn’t support it. Whatever comes next for the church, it won’t be a return to the 1950s.

### **What Do We Do With This?**

We must appreciate the reality of 100 million+ people who self-identify as Nones. We must stop treating “the Nones” as a monolithic group. They’re not. Twenty million of them are praying and believing right now. Thirty-three million of them have moved on completely. Thirty-six million claim spirituality they’re not actually practicing. And eleven million are fighting battles that seem to be making them miserable. We must recognize that one size doesn’t fit all. Different responses are needed for different needs. We must examine ourselves — individually and institutionally

**In addition to the Nones:** There are 200 million+ people who self-identify as Christian in the United States. But more than half indicate that they seldom or never attend church. That’s another 100 million+ folks with no meaningful connection with or commitment to a local church family.

As we enter 2026, let’s embrace the opportunity and privilege of engaging these diverse communities of neighbors: Prayer, creativity, risk-taking, listening, compassion, courage, truth, urgency, and authenticity will be needed.

Many local seniors experience great difficulty leaving home and find it challenging to obtain and/or prepare healthy meals. Hundreds have no one to talk with or check on them on a regular basis. Meals-on-Wheels is a community-based program meeting these needs daily.

PHBC participates in Meals-On-Wheels every 2nd Monday of the Month at 10:00 am. Volunteers meet at Church and deliver packaged meals to residents on a route along Robinhood-Polo-Peace Haven Roads. There are approximately 12-15 stops and the time required is about 90 minutes. Pastor Nathan generally drives and two additional persons for delivery is ideal.
